THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

HABAKKUK 1:1-4, 2:1-4

Reader A reading from the book of Habakkuk.

The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw. O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save? Why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. So the law becomes slack and justice never prevails. The wicked surround the righteous--therefore judgment comes forth perverted. I will stand at my watchpost, and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to

see what he will say to me, and what he will answer concerning my complaint. Then the Lord answered me and said: Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. For there is still a vision for the

appointed time; it speaks of the end, and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay. Look at the proud! Their spirit is not right in them, but the righteous live by their faith.

THE NICENE CREED

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Give us compassionate hearts and resolute spirits to offer solace where none is now found. Great is your faithfulness;

People **O God, we hope in you.**

Reader God of tender mercy, you hear the cries of those who suffer. Enfold them in your steadfast love. Take special care of those who do not, or cannot, cry out, but wait quietly in hope. Give voice to those who should not wait quietly; empower them with strength and support all around: the lonely, the unnoticed; and those carrying the burden of an old burden, a silent grief, or an unvoiced fear. Help us receive the gift of life you have bestowed on us in the soaring light of your gospel. Great is your faithfulness;

Presider We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. For in these last days you sent Jesus to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world.
