### **Quiet Before Worship**

As you enter, you will likely notice an atmosphere of serenity and reverence. Most Episcopalians try not to talk to one another in church before a service. Instead we use this time for personal meditation and devotions.

### The Feast of the Epiphany

This special day commemorates the manifestation of Christ to the peoples of the earth. During the first centuries of the Christian Era, the winter solstice was observed on January 6. Christians chose this day to celebrate the various manifestations, or "epiphanies," of Jesus' divinity. These showings of his divinity included his birth, the coming of the Magi, his baptism, and the Wedding at Cana where he miraculously changed water into wine. The day was called "The Feast of Lights." Celebration of the Son of God replaced celebration of the sun.

understanding of the mystery of Christ. In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power. Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.

# THE HOLY GOSPEL

**MATTHEW 2:1-12** 

Reader The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea;

for so it has been written by the prophet: `And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'" Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had

heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

All People seeking to know Jesus Christ and the love of God more deeply are invited to receive Communion in the Episcopal Church.


Please inform an usher if you need to receive Communion at your seat. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. Wine (not grape juice) is served from the chalice. If for any reason you prefer not to receive the bread and wine, simply cross your arms over your chest as you come forward that you might receive a blessing instead.

### **Communion in One Kind**

The doctrine of the Eucharist affirms the simultaneous presence of Christ's body and blood in each of the Eucharistic elements (the bread and the wine). It contradicts a narrow identification of Christ's body with the bread and Christ's blood with the wine, but it upholds the truth that the fullness of communion is available by receiving either the consecrated bread or wine. The communicant who receives Christ's body and blood in one kind - the bread only has fully received the sacrament of Holy Communion. At St. James some refrain from sharing the common cup under pandemic conditions.
