ACTS 3:12-19

Reader A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Easter Ritual

During the Fifty Days of Easter (the period of rejoicing in the Risen Lord between the Easter Vigil and Pentecost), the Paschal Candle is lighted at all services and "Alleluia" is said or sung on all possible occasions. The church is decorated festively. There is no fasting, and traditionally there was no kneeling. For those who are able, the absence of kneeling during the Easter season is observed at St. James. The congregation stands for the Eucharistic prayer and to receive communion, reviving the directive of the Council of Nicea which forbade kneeling during Eastertide. Traditionally, the liturgical color of the season is white, except for the Day of Pentecost, which is red.

The Easter Season

Easter proclaims the Paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and our participation in those mighty events. The central theme is our passage with Christ through the grave to the risen life, celebrated in baptism, in Eucharist, and in the Easter festival. The period from The Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost, gives us the opportunity to celebrate the resurrection begun in Christ, continued in the life of the apostolic Church, and working in us still. It encompasses Ascension Day and the Day of Pentecost, which are parts of the whole seasonal celebration.

The Historic Creed

We say the Creed as our response to the Word of God. In these historic words, we take ownership of the Creed's cosmic narrative about God's disclosure to humanity. It affirms the source of everything that is including the story of Jesus becoming human. Its conclusion affirms the work of the Holy Spirit in the church, in one baptism, and in our hope for the life to come. The Nicene Creed is a sign of with Christians throughout all times and places. Though originally composed at an ancient time (325 CE), it expresses key insights into the nature of God and creation. This version follows the Greek original precisely by saying "was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary," to emphasize that Mary was an active participant in the Incarnation. The words "and the Son," were not a part of the original Greek text of the Creed and are not included. At its General Convention of 1988 The Episcopal Church said they favored this omission. The decision was later approved by the Lambeth Conference of the Anglican Communion.

as they exalt your sovereign rule in song.




